



Description

Preceptors obtain **2 units of credit in PSIO 391** for assisting with **two lab sections**.

Preceptors will assist with two lab sections of the same course (PSIO 201 *or* PSIO 202).

Each lab is 1 hr 50 mins in length.

Eligibility

- Cumulative GPA of 3.00 or higher
- Successful completion of both PSIO 201 and 202 with grades of A or B
 - NOTE: Current PSIO 202 students are welcome to submit applications during priority registration to begin the preceptorship the following semester, pending successful completion of PSIO 202

Duties & Responsibilities

Preceptors are required to:

- Attend two assigned lab sections weekly.
- Attend weekly preceptor meetings:
 - PSIO 201: ***Mondays 3:00pm – 4:15pm*** in Koffler 560
 - **In observance of Martin Luther King, Jr. Day on Monday, Jan. 20th, 2025, we will be holding a *brief* preceptor orientation meeting via Zoom on Monday, January 13th, 2025, as a substitute for our first preceptor meeting.**
 - PSIO 202: ***Fridays 8:30am – 9:45am*** in Koffler 510
 - Preceptors may miss one meeting per semester without penalty, but remain responsible for obtaining the information presented at the meeting
- Complete readings, pre-labs, and quizzes in advance of each meeting and prepare for activities.
- Lead small group activities to emphasize difficult concepts in anatomy and physiology.
- Help proctor lab practicals and lecture exams
- Hold joint office hours with a TA in advance of lab practicals
- Work well in a team-teaching environment, and follow all department and course policies
- Complete additional duties as described at the start of the semester (e.g., checking pre-lab assignments for completion, developing practical review materials, holding practical review sessions, etc.)

Grading

Grades will be assigned based on attendance and preparedness for lab and preceptor meetings. The following grades are possible: S (superior), P (pass), F (fail). The teaching assistants and the course instructors will assign grades. A Superior (S) grade will only be assigned to preceptors that exceed expectations during lab sessions and preceptor meetings. Preceptors that meet expectations will earn a Pass (P) and those that do not meet expectations will receive a Fail (F).
